- 3. Only home grown / homemade produce to be shown. All craft items must have been made, crafted or created during the previous 12 months ie since 1st September 2024.**
- 4. All exhibits must be left with the section steward in the hall on Saturday 30th August from 9.00-10.00am and will NOT be accepted later.**
- 5. From 11.00am to 12.30pm only judges and officials will be allowed in the hall. NO items entered are to be removed until after the prize-giving.**
- 6. Entering items in the Village Show presumes you are giving your permission to include your name in the village newsletter should you be lucky enough to win a prize! If not, please let us know.**
